The protagonist is the one the reader follows throughout the narrative and is typically involved in the issues, turning points, and resolution of the tale, sometimes referred to as the protagonist or hero, yet the protagonist and the main character are not usually the same. In popular media like film, the viewer easy to notice the main character shown in the film that often being seen and easy to notice with the most dialogue along with interaction as the plot of the film going on. According to Britannica, a film—also referred to as a movie or motion picture—is a sequence of still images from film that are rapidly successively projected onto a screen by light. In the film, there's also a serial film where a film series is a collection of interrelated, sequential movies that share the same fictional world. Each movie in a series contains parts of a larger story and often timest the episode run until 8 or 10 episodes long then have a couple of season, depending on the story of the series itself. Umbrella Academy (2019), a popular science fiction series aired on Netflix on 2019 and have 10 episodes long for the first Season, the synopsis of the series tells us that one day in 1989, 43 babies were mysteriously born to unrelated women who showed no signs of pregnancy the previous day. Seven of them were adopted by billionaire industrialist Sir Reginald Hargreeves, who founded the Umbrella Academy and prepared his "children" to save the world. However, in their adult years, the team of the teen superheroes fall apart and the family parted ways. Fast-forward to the present,

when the six surviving family members reunite after hearing the news of Hargreeves' passing. Together they solve the mystery surrounding their father's death, but different personalities and abilities again tear the estranged family apart, and a global apocalypse becomes an impending threat. The series is based on a collection of comics and graphic novels created and written by My Chemical Romance front man Gerard Way.

The American series "Umbrella Academy" has gained significant attention due to its complex and interesting main characters. In this paper, the author will discuss the psychoanalysis of the main characters to uncover the motivations, conflicts, and psychological dynamics underlying their actions. By examining the characters through the psychoanalytic perspective, the author aims to acquire more insight into a deeper understanding of their behavior and the factors that shape their personalities. There are three factors that, according to Freud's psychoanalytic theory, shape a person's personality, namely Id, Ego and Superego. The author want to explains the three levels of psychological structure and provides readers with information on how the main characters can affect a person's psychotic behavior so that by understanding the three levels, we can find solutions to the problems faced by individuals, which is very important in social life. Hence why, the author aim in choosing this theory is to analyze the personalities and psychic within each other of the main characters of Umbrella Academy by Freud's theory in Id, Ego and Superego.

2. Method

The method used by this study is descriptive qualitative research, using Sigmund Freud's psychoanalysis in Id, Ego and Superego. A qualitative descriptive approach, according to Moleong (2005:4), is a research approach whose data is expressed in the form of words or images and not in the form of numbers. Interviews, field notes, pictures, video recordings, memos, notes, and other types of documentation can all provide this information.

Psychoanalysis is a way of treating mental problems that is influenced by psychoanalytic theory and stresses unconscious mental processes. It is sometimes known as "depth psychology." This idea seeks to treat mental health disorders by investigating the conscious and unconscious minds. From this method, this study aims to analyze the Psychoanalysis of the Main Characters as in American Series of Umbrella Academy. The method of collecting it by taking notes of the personalities from the main characters personalities then analyzing it by Freud's Id, Ego and Superego.

The series "Umbrella Academy" narrates the story of six principal characters, who are primarily the siblings of Hargreeves, adopted by Sir Reginald Hargreeves, an eccentric billionaire. Sir Reginald adopted seven children from around the globe in response to the extraordinary event that occurred in 1984, wherein forty-three women worldwide simultaneously gave birth. As time progresses, only six of the siblings remain, living separately until they are reunited following their father's death. The main characters include Luther, Diego, Allison, Klaus, Number Five, and Vanya. They confront an imminent threat concerning the potential end of the world while simultaneously unraveling mysteries and evading the show's antagonist.

Personality of 6 Hargreeves' sibling as the Main Characters of the series, in this section, author found the Id, Ego and Superego of the six main characters as the author classifies them within different tables and sort them according on what the author found in the 10 episodes of the Umbrella Academy series.

The Id, the id is the instinctive part of the personality that seeks immediate gratification of needs and desires, without considering social norms, morals, or consequences. The id is driven by the pleasure principle, which aims to avoid pain and discomfort and seek its own pleasure and fulfillment (Freud, 1979:25). According to Hall (2019), this principle of enjoyment aims to maintain its constancy in the face of external and internal disturbances.

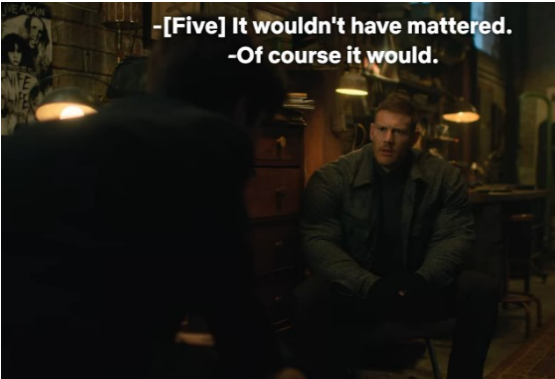
